<u>Business Damage Assessment Survey:</u> Florida Governor Ron DeSantis has announced the activation of the Business Damage Assessment survey to assess the impact of COVID-19 on Florida's local businesses. The survey, managed by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), will evaluate businesses affected by COVID-19 and the impacts the virus has had on the local economy so actions to implement economic relief programs for businesses can begin.

Why is this important? Actively participating in this survey will provide data on Florida's business economic losses and may prove useful in future relief efforts from the Federal or State government.

What are the next steps? Once the state has enough surveys/evidence of economic impact, the state and federal governments can move forward with activating the path for SBA Loans and Florida Disaster Bridge Loans for business.

EMERGENCY BRIDGE LOAN FOR SMALL BUSINESS

<u>Florida Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan</u> Program is currently available to small business owners located in all FL counties statewide that are experiencing economic damage as a result of COVID-19. Check out this website <u>daily</u> for new info: <u>https://floridadisasterloan.org/</u>

Loan Details

- Designated Disaster Areas: All Florida counties statewide per Executive Order 20-52.
- Qualified Applicant: Applications will be accepted by qualified for-profit, privately held small businesses that maintain a place of business in the state of Florida. All qualified applicants must have been established prior to March 9, 2020, and suffered economic injury as a result of the designated disaster. Qualified small business applicants must be an employer business with 2 to 100 employees.
- Amount: Up to \$50,000 per eligible small business. Loans of up to \$100,000 may be made in special cases as warranted by the need of the eligible small business.
- Term: 1 year.
- **Limitation**: Only one loan may be made per eligible business. All previous bridge loans received MUST be paid in full.
- Interest Rate: Loans will be interest-free for the loan term (1 year). The Interest rate will be 12% per annum on the unpaid balance thereafter, until the loan balance is repaid in full. Loan default is subject to a normal commercial collection process.
- Application Period: Applications will be accepted by qualified Florida small businesses under this program through May 8, 2020, contingent on the availability of funds.

Get Started

- 1. Review eligibility requirements and loan process.
- 2. Download, complete and sign the application form.
- 3. Gather required support documentation.
- 4. Contact and submit completed and signed application and support documentation to your local Florida Small Business Development Center (SBDC). You can locate your local SBDC at www.FloridaSBDC.org/locations.
